VOA Express – A TV show airing five days a week on satellite and the Internet featuring stories about the U.S., Vietnam, and global news and trends.

Vietnam In Focus – A Monday-through-Friday program that includes in-depth interviews with newsmakers about issues related to Vietnam.

Eye on Vietnam - A weekly feature covering all aspects of Vietnamese life with a special focus on Vietnam's diaspora. It also offers an in-depth analysis of Vietnam-related developments, as well as human-interest stories.

The Vietnamese Service broadcasts a daily 30-minute radio news program on medium wave and two podcasts of 30-minutes and 60-minutes for listeners on the website, SoundCloud, Audio Now and subscribers in the iTunes store.
