

VOA Broadcasting in Kurdish

VOA's Kurdish Service reaches its audience on radio, television and the Internet. In addition to shortwave and AM, the programs air on FM affiliates in several cities in Iraq (Erbil, Sulaymaniyah, Kirkuk, Mosul, Baghdad, and Basra). VOA Kurdish also produces video reports that are streamed on its website. The service's audience consists of more than 30 million Kurds living in the Middle East and Eurasia and approximately one million Kurds living in Europe and North America. Audience research indicates that the broadcasts are popular among listeners in Iran, Iraq, Syria, and Turkey.

Programs and Features

TV

Kurd Connection – A 30-minute television/web program airing on Tuesdays and Fridays through affiliate NRT in Northern Iraq. It includes a roundup of newsrelated material and features of interest to the Kurdish region. The program is also distributed via the web and YouTube.

Kurdvision -- A 30-minute weekly TV show airing through Ozgur Gun TV based in Diyarbakir Turkey. It is a roundup of news-related material and features of interest to the Kurds in Turkey. Video reports and on-camera interviews from the show are also streamed on both Sorani and Kurmanji Kurdish dialects websites.

Radio

The daily radio shows offer extensive regional and international news coverage, interviews with experts and newsmakers, stringer reports, panel discussions with Kurds in the greater Middle East and in the diaspora, and call-in shows that link listeners with guests who discuss topics of interest. The shows also include daily sports news and press reviews from U.S., regional, and international newspapers. Special features offered discuss life in America, the Kurdish diaspora, youth issues, health, literature and culture, women's issues, science and technology, economy, and Kurdish and American music.

Hello Washington on Friday – A 30-minute weekly current affairs program with expert guests taking calls from the Middle East and other areas of the world.

Three 30-minute call-in shows: **We and Politics** on Mondays, **Dimensions of the Current Developments** on Wednesdays, and **With the Events** on Thursdays.

Life with Culture – A weekly 30-minute arts and culture radio/web program airing on Sundays in Sorani dialect.

Deng U Reng (Sound and Color) - arts and culture feature in the Kurmanji dialect.

Rawanga (View) -- a roundtable discussion on Iran and Kurds in that country.

Tirej -- focuses mainly on Turkey Kurds and Syria in Kurmanji dialect.

Sense & Stance - a call-in program specifically on Syria.
