<u>Eye on America</u>, a daily news program on U.S. news and U.S.-China relations. It airs in the morning local time.

<u>Issues & Opinions</u>, a news and talk program on major development in China.

<u>*Pro & Con*</u>, a weekly talk show debating controversial issues related to Chinese politics, economics, and U.S.-China relations.

<u>Strait Talk</u>, a weekly show co-produced with Broadcasting Corporation of Taiwan. Callers from China and Taiwan meet on-air to discuss news and issues of common interest.

<u>*Cultural Odyssey*</u>, a weekly TV magazine on American life and entertainment.

<u>History's Mysteries</u>, an occasional hour long TV documentary program focusing on untold stories, suppressed memories and distorted narratives in China's recent past.

<u>Learn a Word</u>, a daily one-minute segment introducing useful English words for daily use.

<u>Duo English</u>, a conversational English teaching video program for young Mandarin speakers interested in learning how to speak like a native.

Windows on the World, a daily four-hour current affairs program.

<u>Sports English</u>, as the title suggests, this segment teaches phrases and expressions used in sports.
