- The website serves as a resource for verifying the increasing volume of disinformation and misinformation initiating in Russia, China, Iran, Turkey, Venezuela and elsewhere.
- A team of journalists at VOA researches and analyzes quotes, stories and reports distributed by government officials, government-sponsored media and other high-profile individuals. The reporters separate fact from fiction, add context and debunk false and misleading information.
- Polygraph.info's audiences have increased on the web and on social media, attracting new readers and viewers throughout the nations of the former Soviet Union.
- Polygraph.info is produced in English. Many Polygraph. info fact checks are republished by other sites, including

Echo Moskvy and in Russia, Stopfake.org in Ukraine and on the The Atlantic Council's Disinfo Portal.

IMPACT

- In FY 2020, average weekly article views on Polygraph. info reached 25,000, an increase of 73 percent over two years prior.
- Polygraph.info's fact-check videos reach thousands more each week on YouTube. One debunking 5G as a cause of COVID-19 hit nearly 600,000 views.
- During the pandemic, Polygraph.info promoted daily fact-checks on COVID-19 and factual news on the virus.
