## **VOA CHARTER**

President Gerald Ford signed the VOA Charter into law in 1976. It protects the independence and integrity of VOA programming.

- 1. VOA will serve as a consistently reliable and authoritative source of news. VOA news will be acurate, objective, and comprehensive.
- 2. VOA will represent America, not any single segment of American society, and will therefore present a balanced and comprehensive projection of significant American thought and institutions.
- **3. VOA** will present the policies of the United States clearly and effectively, and will also present responsible discussions and opinion on these policies.


